Robin Porter is Chief Executive for Luton Council and London Luton Airport Ltd.

Recent challenges facing us as a community in Luton have been among the largest the town has ever faced. Rising to those challenges has been something single no group organisation could have accomplished alone.

Working with Luton Foodbank, the council has given help and support throughout the community in ways that otherwise would not have been possible.

Over the Christmas period, the council pledged money from the government's Covid Winter Grant scheme to partner with Luton Foodbank. Its many contacts in the voluntary and community sector allowed it to support individuals and families in hardship but not immediately eligible for free school meals.

The council has also been working with Luton Foodbank to reach out to other organisations to better coordinate relief, and to support initiatives across the town. This includes ensuring all those likely to need its help know about it, and liaising with schools to promote the work of the foodbank.
