## Salvation Army

The Salvation Army's Luton corps is a valued partner in our battle against hunger. Major Ralph Walker has kindly agreed to tell us a little about what being a Luton Foodbank referrer means to him.





"Where there's a need, there's The Salvation Army" – this famous quotation has never been more relevant than when we give food to the lonely, vulnerable, and homeless in Luton today. It's what we at The Salvation Army do week in, week out. Part of that service is being a referrer for Luton Foodbank.

Every Tuesday morning people from all walks of life come through our doors —many have not eaten for some time; others they are relieved that they will able to feed their children. Whatever their circumstances, there is no judgement, just a welcome into a warm friendly environment, a quick form filled out and off you go with the food.

If we discover that debt is the reason a person or family have so little money, we can referral them to The Salvation Army Debt Advice Service. This is a totally free service who will work alongside the client, helping them budget and become debt free. The first step is writing to all their creditors and asking them to freeze the interest while we work out the best solution for the client, which may include a DRO (debt relief order) or repayment plan.

There is no greater feeling than when I see the faces of people knowing that on that day they will be able to eat. That feeling is possible because of the hard work and joint effort of Luton Foodbank and Luton Salvation Army.
